Biographical Sketch of Dr. William Moser
Department of Mathematics and Statistics
McGill University

Dr. Moser is a respected member of the Canadian mathematical community, who has served as editor-in-chief of the Canadian Mathematical Bulletin and as president of the Canadian Mathematical Society. He took his retirement in 1997 and was immediately appointed Professor Emeritus by McGill University. The Canadian Mathematical Society granted him the 2003 Distinguished Service Award.

William Oscar Jules Moser was born in 1927 in Winnipeg, MB, Canada. He married Beryl Rita Pearlman in 1953 and together they have 3 children: Marla, Lionel and Paula.

Moser's education began at the University of Manitoba where he obtained a Bachelor of Science (honours) degree (1949), and continued to the University of Minnesota where he was granted his Master's in 1951. Under the advisory of Donald Coxeter, Moser completed his PhD in mathematics at the University of Toronto in 1957.

Moser's academic career began at the University of Saskatchewan where he was an Associate Professor from 1956-1960. From there, he moved to the University of Manitoba where he was also an Associate Professor from 1959-1964. His final placement was at McGill University in 1964 (Professor from 1966-) where he stayed until his retirement in 1997.

During the years, Dr. Moser and his family spent time in England and Paris while on sabbatical leaves from McGill, but Montreal remains their home.

Some of his close professional friendships include: Donald Coxeter, Paul Erdős, Sy Schuster, etc.

His most famous publication was "Generators and relations for discrete groups, 1957" with Donald Coxeter. This work has garnered attention for its longevity and importance as it is currently in its 8th edition. Dr. Moser is still publishing books in the field of mathematics with fellow mathematicians.

It is important to note that Prof. Moser's main contribution to the mathematical world is within the field of geometry.

Scope and Content:

The Fonds consist of both personal and professional correspondence relating to his mathematical career. Colleagues and friends from the mathematical profession have provided letters (incoming/outgoing), publications, newspaper and magazine clippings, and CV's over the course of 66 years. Correspondence comes from H.S.M. Coxeter, Donald O.Hebb, Paul Erdős, Béla Bollobás, John Conway, Janos Komlos, J.A.H. Hunter, and other notables within the field of mathematics. In all, they comprise of 72 cm of textual records, as well as 7 photographs depicting family and friends of Dr. Moser's and a painting; includes one audiotape.

Much of the correspondence relates to the "Double Taxation Convention" between the German Federal Republic and Canada.

File 00083

Rottenberg, Reuven R.: The file consists of applications and curriculum vitae of R.R. Rottenber for possible professorship at McGill University; Rottenber comes from Israel.

Schroeder, Hilde: The file consists of three copies of "Certificate of Merit awarded to Hilde Schroeder"... signed by fellow faculty members. Schroeder was a long-time secretary for the Department of Mathematics, McGill University.

Schwerdtfeger, Hans: The file consists of correspondence of Hans and Hanna Schwerdtfeger; photocopies of mathematical book reviews (written in German) from the early 1950's; obituary pamphlets of Dr. Schwerdtfeger; the dates for this file indicate 1951-1994, though the bulk of the information runs from 1971-1994.

Lang, Serge: The file consists of one audiocassette called "S. Lang: KPFA"; as well, copies of articles written by Lang for the New York Review of Books and other publications; various correspondence from publishers and colleagues. Lang is also a mathematician who has written many books within the field.

Dirac, Gabriel Andrew: The file consists of correspondence, letters of recommendations; as well, many letters concerning Dirac's Visa for working in Canada; obituary notices of Dirac and condolence letters on behalf of colleagues of Dr. Moser's. Incoming and outgoing mail; correspondence originates in London (Cambridge), East Germany, Winnipeg, and Denmark. An attempt has been made to sort items in chronological order.

Goodman, Jacob: The file consists of one letter concerning Jacob Goodman for suitability of "Distinguished Professor".

File 00090

Magic Cubes: The file consists of one pamphlet on various "magic cubes", similar to the Rubik's Cube.

File 00091

Coxeter, H.S.M.: Note: there is an entire binder on Coxeter; this single file contains 2 duplicate pamphlets called "ICM: a pictorial record" Vancouver 1974—photos of Coxeter can be found within; as well, an obituary notice of Donald Coxeter (Globe and Mail, April 12, 2003); publication: "Some Applications of Trilinear Coordinates" by H.S.M. Coxeter, one photo (printed from computer) of Coxeter and (great) grandson? and letters of correspondence regarding Coxeter's death.

Coxeter, H.S.M.: The file consists of a speech from Coxeter's 80th birthday (1987) and old notes on Zonohedra, etc. written by Coxeter (1950's).
