## FIRST CANADIAN NISEI ADMITTED TO BAR

George T. Tamaki

In a brief ceremony at Halifax, Nova Scotia, George Tamaki, graduate of the University of British Columbia and Dalhousie University, was admitted to the Bar Association of Nova Scotia, on Tuesday, July 9th. Thus another chapter has been added to the many pages of Nisei history-in-the making in Canada.

Tamaki, who graduated with the highest honors from Dalhousie, during the war years, was not admitted at that time, due to racial differences, but has now become the first nisei to be able to practice law in Canada. At present, Mr. Tamaki is associated with the C.G.F. Government in Saskatchewan, as a legal counsel to the economic planning board.

## RICE DISTRIBUTION

Rice ration to Japanese has been cut from 15 lbs. to 10 lbs. per month per person. This is an order from the Wartime Price and Trade Board. Due to great shortages in rice coming into the country, the allotment for Japanese in Montreal has been cut to 5,000 lbs. per month. Rice is generally available around the middle of the month, and people should phone in to Wolfe's Grocery to confirm it and pick up their ration immediately.

### MONTREAL NISEI SOFTBALL LEAGUE GAMES COMPLETED

The Verdun softball team captained by Rosie Okuda finished in first place in the

M.N.S.L. The last of the scheduled games were played on the 28th of July, when Verdun clinched first spot by defeating Fellowship by the score of 5 - 0, the season's first shut out. St. Luc defeated Centre to take second slot while Skeena won its game from Westmount 20 - 19.

### VERDUN - WESTMOUNT TAKE SEMI-FINALS

Verdun eliminated Centre in a closely fought two-out of-three series, taking two with the scores, 3-2, 6-7, and 7-0. Hiro Uchida, the Verdun mound ace pitched all three games and won his 2nd shut-out. Hiro allowed only 11 hits in three games while Sammy I shihara of Centre allowed 15 hits.

Westmount took their series from St. Luc with the scores, 19-11, 2-7, 17-11. Kaz Nishio was in the mound for the three games for Westmount. Frank Yoshy and Singy Suefuji alternated for St. Luc as hurlers. In the second game Singy Suefuji allowed only one hit to Westmount, adding more laurels to his personal achievement of striking out most batters in one game, 13; hitting most home runs, 5 during the season.
