FIRST CANADIAN NISEL ADMITTED TO BAR

In a brief ceremony at Halifax, Nova Scotia, George Tanaki, graudate of the University of British Columbia and Dalhousie University, was admitted to the Bar Association of Nova Scotia, on Tuesday, July 9th. Thus another chapter has been added to the many pages of Nisei history-in-the making in Canada.

Tamaki, who graduated with the highest honors from Dalhousie, during the war years, was not admitted at that time, due to racial differences, but has now become the first nise to be able to practice law in Canada. At present, Mr. Tamaki is associated with the C.G.F. Government in Saskatchewan, as a logal counsel to the economic planning board.
